The Structure of the Course

Unit 1: Dynamic Planet

This unit is assessed through a 1 hour written exam (higher or foundation) worth 25%.

Unit 2: People and the Planet

- 🌐 Changing Cities
- 🌐 Development Dilemmas

This unit is assessed through a 1 hour written exam (higher or foundation) worth 25%.

We are hoping that either the Unit 1 or Unit 2 exam will be taken at the end of Year 10.

Unit 3: Making Geographical Decisions

A written exam based on pre-released resource materials assessing student's ability to make decisions about geographical issues. It is related to sustainable development and environmental issues. This one hour exam (higher and foundation), is worth 25%.

Unit 4: Researching Geography

A fieldwork investigation and written report completed in class time under controlled conditions based on either coastal environments or city environments. The report is worth 25% of the final grade.

Fieldwork is an important part of the course, with an optional residential fieldtrip to Norfolk in Year 11 or a local day trip.
