YEAR 10 CURRICULUM ENRICHMENT DAY – TUESDAY 6TH JULY

DESCRIPTIONS OF ACTIVITIES

Art: Trip to Cambridge University Botanical Gardens

The Art Department is offering Year 9 and 10 students the opportunity to take part in a visit to the Cambridge University Botanical Gardens.

The visit involves participating in a walk of the area, allowing students to participate in observational drawing activities and to have an opportunity to take photographs.

This activity will directly link to, and help to enhance the GCSE and BTEC coursework assignment on natural forms and collections. Travel will be by coach to Cambridge. Students will need to be in school at the normal time. We aim to arrive back by 3.30 pm. Students should wear school uniform and bring a pen, tonal pencils, rubber, sketchbook and packed lunch.

Drama: Workshops and theatre trip to Woman in Black

We are offering Year 9 and 10 students the opportunity to take part in a drama activity day on Tuesday 6th July. This combines a workshop with a visit to see 'Woman in Black'. While this will be a valuable experience for all pupils, we strongly recommend that BTEC and GCSE Drama students attend.

Students should arrive at school at the normal time wearing clothes suitable for movement. The morning will be spent practically exploring the text. Students are advised to bring a packed lunch. We will then depart from Beaumont by coach at 1pm to see a performance of 'Woman in Black' at the Fortune Theatre in London. We will return to the Quadrant, Marshalswick at approximately 7pm.

Music: Concert – Havana Cultura at the Barbican

We are offering Year 9 and 10 students the opportunity to take part in a Cuban Son/Salsa activity afternoon followed by an evening's concert at the Barbican Centre in London by Gilles Peterson & Roberto Fonseca, which involves an evening of Latin, afro jazz and fusion to hip hop, funk, reggaeton and R&B Music. Whilst this is a valuable experience for all pupils, we strongly recommend that GCSE Music students attend.

Students should arrive at school at 12pm dressed in casual, but presentable clothing. They should bring a packed lunch and packed dinner. The coach will depart from Beaumont at 5pm for a 7.30pm performance in the Barbican Centre. We will return to the Quadrant, Marshalswick at approximately 11-11.30pm.

Economics: Trip to the Bank of England

The Economics and Business Department is organising a visit for Year 10 students to the Bank of England. The visit involves participating in a guided tour of the Bank of England Museum and an educational talk on the importance of the Bank of England in managing the UK Economy. You will also have a chance to feel the weight of a bar of gold!

The visit will directly link to, and help to enhance the GCSE Economics and Business students understanding of the wider world affecting business and the UK economy as a whole. Travel will be by coach to London. Students will need to register at school as normal. We aim to arrive back by 3.30 pm. Students should wear school uniform and bring a pen, clipboard and packed lunch.

History: Jack the Ripper

The History Department is organising a visit for Year 10 students. The visit involves participating in a guided walk of the sites of the Jack the Ripper murders, which took place in London in 1888. The walk is organised and led by Discovery Tours and Events Ltd, a company with many years' experience in this field.

The visit will directly link to, and help to enhance the GCSE History coursework assignment on Jack the Ripper which students will be working on later in Year 11. Travel will be by coach to London. We aim to arrive back by 3.30 pm. Students should wear school uniform and bring a packed lunch.

PE: Trip to the Olympic Park site

Beaumont PE department is offering all Year 9 and 10 pupils a unique opportunity to visit the site where the London 2012 Olympics will be held. The trip consists of a tour of the site in Stratford where the Opening and Closing Ceremony will take place along with the Athletics and a visit to the Velopark and Basketball arena. Pupils will also have the opportunity to take in a panoramic view of the Olympic park from one of the official viewing points.

The tour will be guided by a 2012 official tour guide and will leave school promptly at 9am returning at 3.30pm at the very latest. Pupils will be travelling for some time on a coach and will also have a walking tour of some of the site. All pupils should bring plenty to eat and drink for the day and comfortable shoes for the walking part of the tour. Pupils do not need to wear uniform.

First Aid: Emergency Aid Qualification – in school

Year 9 and 10 students are being offered the opportunity to complete a First Aid Qualification. The course is taken by qualified instructors from First Responders and will take place during the normal school day. During the course students will cover the following:

Casualty Assessment	Head injuries	Burns / scalds
Resuscitation	Unconsciousness	Injuries to bones
Wounds / bleeding	Medical conditions	Legal requirements
Shock	Poisons	First aid box

Relevance to courses in school: If students are studying BTEC First Certificate in Sport, this qualification can be used as evidence for one of the assignments in Unit 2, covering both a pass and Merit instead of writing up a report on First Aid.

ICT – in school

During the day students will use ICT to create a range of broadcasting documents using a variety of software such as Publisher, Power Point and Movie Maker.
